## "Advent – A Monologue"

"I was a simple man living a quiet life in Nazareth. I worked as a carpenter and loved doing a good job. One day that I will never forget, I turned around and there was Mary. I stopped and reveled in the beauty of my future wife. She looked troubled and her thoughts seemed to be far off. She almost looked afraid as she approached me and I took her hands in mine.

"Then, she told me that she was with child. The words struck like a sharp knife into my heart. I dropped her

hands as if they were filled with leprosy. I had pledged my love to her in front of witnesses. I asked who the father was. I knew that I was not. She said an angel had appeared to her. She would have a son through the Holy Ghost.

"I turned my back on her and she ran out of the shop crying. I didn't know what to do. By rights, I should take her before the Sanhedrin, divulge her shame and condemn her to be stoned. When I think back I realize we held in our hands the love of someone who was so great that He could save the entire world. We were so blessed."

Notes: We don't hear much about Joseph but he had a lot of responsibility put on him. From the beginning his faith was tested. He had to accept the fact that Mary had conceived this child by the Holy Spirit. He was told by God to name the child, Jesus. He had the reasonability of taking care of Mary during the pregnancy. His age is often discussed as being older than Mary but we are not told that anywhere in the Bible and it was and is, not important. For approximately 32 years Jesus was his son on earth and according to the Bible people thought of Jesus as one of the children of Mary and Joseph. The verses below summarize the times that Joseph is mentioned in the Bible and his responsibilities.

Joseph to name Jesus: "She will give birth to a son, and you (Joseph) are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Matthew 1:21

Joseph to take Jesus for baptism: "When the time came for the purification rites required by the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord." Luke 2:2

Joseph to take Mary and the child to Egypt for protection: "When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." Matthew 2:13

Joseph takes family back to Galilee: "When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth." Luke 2:39

Joseph raises Jesus as his own son: "Now Jesus himself was about thirty years old when he began his ministry. He was the son, so it was thought, of Joseph, the son of Heli," Luke 3:23 "At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.' They said, 'Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?'" John 6:41

Can we understand why they were questioning? Would we?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, so often we forget the importance of Joseph in carrying out Your will for our lives. Help us to realize that although we also feel at times that we are unimportant, we know that You need each one of us to do our part to spread the Good News over the earth. Help us to realize that Your love, grace, and courage will always be with us as we step out to do Your will. Amen.
