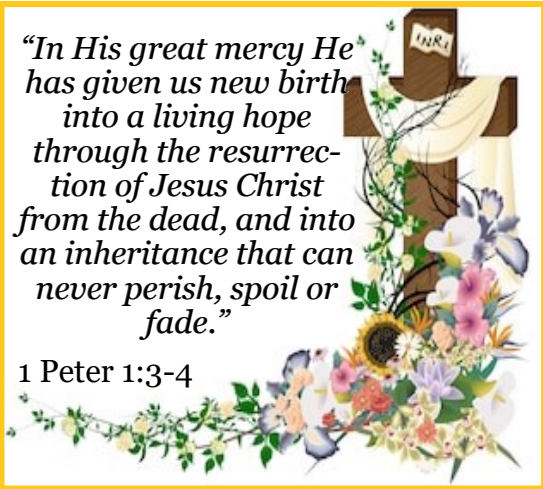


Peter

“After The Resurrection”

“In His great mercy He has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade.”

1 Peter 1:3-4



“I was just a simple fisherman until Jesus called me to be a ‘Fisher of Men.’ I didn’t even fully understand what a ‘fisher of men’ was until after Jesus had died on the cross and arose from the dead. Sure, I wanted to serve Him, but I kept making foolish mistakes. I was confused as to how a man born on this earth could be a Heavenly King and not a king of the people.

“I had been to the mountain top. I knew Jesus as a personal friend and Lord. I was sure that he was the Messiah. I had everything going for me, but I still had that human weakness. Maybe I was really afraid for my life, deep down. I felt sure the authorities were going to kill Jesus. I didn’t know why exactly. I knew that many people were following his teaching. I may have been so stupid in my humanness to think that if I pretended I didn’t know him, I wouldn’t be killed with him.

“When we were in the garden with Christ and the authorities came to get him, I was the foolish enough and confused enough to draw my sword and attack the servant of the high priest and Christ commanded me to put the sword away.

“On the third day after they had buried Christ, we were all still in shock as to what happened. We believed Jesus was someone special. We had seen him perform miracles and when we recalled what He had told us, we began to think that truly He was the long awaited Messiah. We saw Him bring other people back from the dead including Lazarus, just a few days before. Why couldn’t he have prevented all of this? Then we saw the women who had gone to the grave running towards us. Mary Magdalene was the spokeswoman and she told us that an angel had spoken to them at the grave and told *them* ‘Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him.’

“We immediately started running. John and I got there first and I went right into the tomb and saw the strips of linen lying there as well as the cloth they had wrapped around his head. John went in also. What were we supposed to think? The angel had said Jesus was going to Galilee and we would see him there. Even though he was not there, we questioned ourselves. Had his body been stolen and the

“We went to Galilee and gathered with the other disciples and some other loyal followers in a room that we secured because we were afraid of those who had killed him. We feared the Jewish leaders. Then Jesus appeared through the wall and stood before us. He showed us the wounds in his hands from the nails and he showed us his pierced side. We believed but still didn’t know what to do.

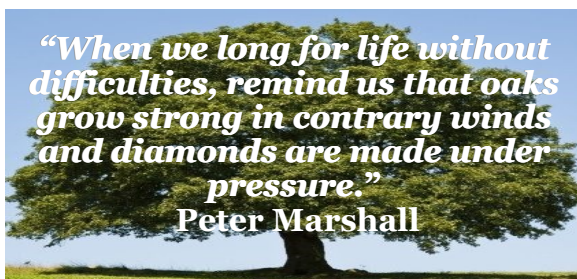
“One day after we had met with Christ and still didn’t know where He was, I said to the other disciples ‘I’m going fishing.’ Some of the other disciples went with me. on the right-hand side of the boat. There were so many fish we couldn't haul in the net! John told me it was Jesus on the shore. I jumped into the water and swam to shore. The others brought in the boat; Jesus already had a fire going. He told me to get some fish from the net and we had breakfast. We knew it was Jesus but we were afraid to tell each other. We were still so confused as to exactly what had happened when we knew that He had been dead and was then alive. He seemed to speak to us in riddles when we did see him.

"Jesus spoke to me as we were on the shore. He asked '*Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?*' '*Yes, Lord,*' I replied, '*you know I love you.*' John 21:15-17 Three times he asked me. 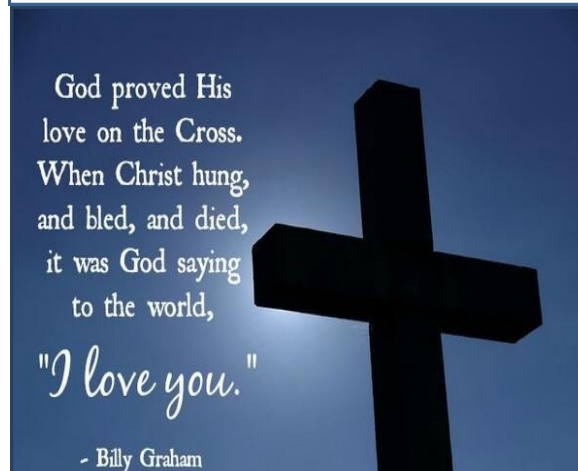


"I was privileged to do this and continued to proclaim the gospel to many people, Jews, Samaritans, and Gentiles.
