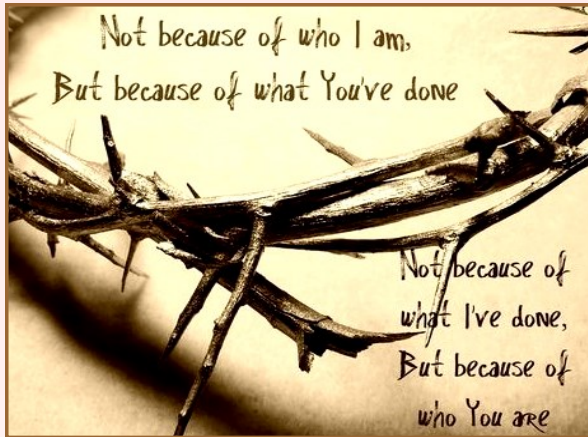


“He is Risen”

“8. The Ministry of Jesus Christ”



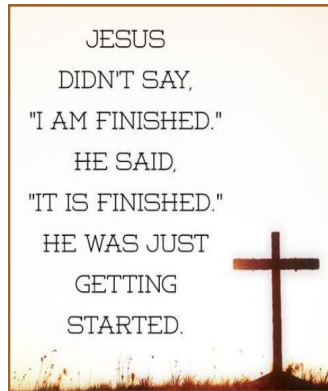
“He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay.” Matthew 28:6

“He’s back; Now What” This comment could well have been made by one of the scribes when Jesus appeared after his death on the cross. The people at the crucifixion had seen Jesus bleeding on the cross. They had seen blood flow from his side. According to Scripture Pilate wanted verification that Jesus had died before he allowed the body to be buried, so he had a Roman guard put a spear into Jesus’ side. Pilate was satisfied because the mixture of blood and water proved that he was dead. He died, but He arose.

Pilate had guards stationed over 24-hour shifts to make sure no one got into the grave to steal his body. They had done everything in their power to make sure He was gone for good.

The authorities feared him and needed to have power back that they felt they were losing to Jesus. They were sure he was gone for good, but then He came back, and what could they do.

As we study the Easter story, we don’t hear anything about the earthly authorities during the forty days Christ spent on the earth before his Ascension. Where were they? What were they planning now? Judas had given their money back. Jesus had too many who were following Him and they had exhausted their power. Were they hiding?

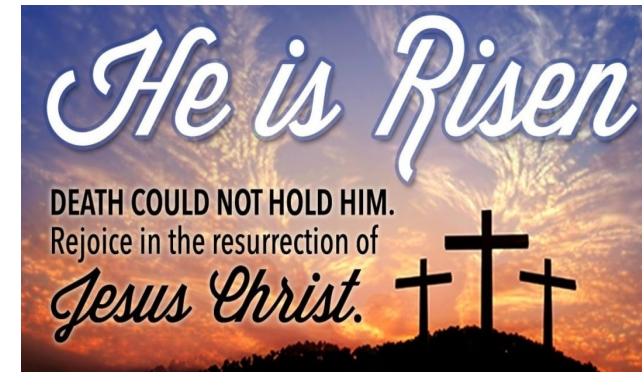


doubted, not just Thomas. The disciples were afraid of the Jews and were hiding in an upper room. John 20:19-23

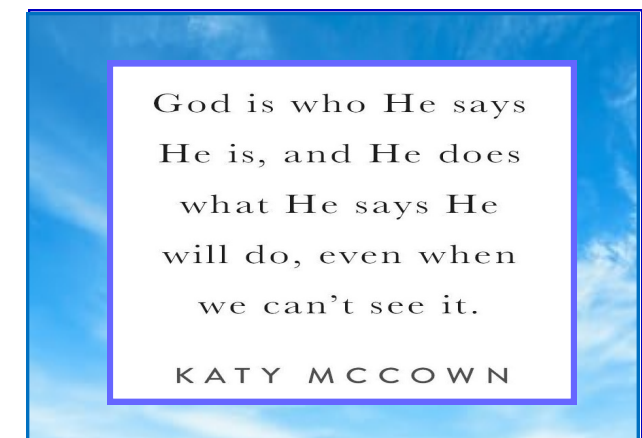
When the women went to the tomb the first day of the week with spices for his body, we are told the stone was rolled away and they went into the tomb but

did not find Jesus. Suddenly two men appeared and asked them “Why do you seek the living One among the dead? He is not here, but He has risen. Remember how He spoke to you while He was still in Galilee, saying that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.” Luke 24



They believed and ran to tell the disciples and others. According to Luke, they thought the women were speaking nonsense and would not believe. But, Peter ran to the tomb. Jesus spoke to him and he believed. Luke 24:34

Jesus walked with two men along the road to Emmaus, but they did not recognize



Him. He asked *“What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?”* The one man named Cleopas replied. *“Are You the only one visiting Jerusalem and unaware of the things which have happened here in these days?”* He said to them *“Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?”* Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures. Luke 24. They talked with him and yet they were blinded until He broke bread while he was eating with them. We don't know why they didn't recognize him while they were all walking together. We don't know for sure who the two men were. There is much speculation.

When he appeared to the disciples and others, Thomas was not there and Thomas doubted. He said *“Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.”* John 20:25

A week later, Jesus walked through the walls into the room where the disciples were gathered and said to Thomas *“Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.”* Thomas said to him, *“My Lord and my God!”*

His blessings to Thomas is for us also. He said to Thomas *“Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.”* John 20:29

Before Christ ascended into Heaven he appeared to a group of five hundred and we know from studying that he traveled to
