

James is represented by three scallop shells which are symbolic of his pilgrimage and mission zeal.

James, the Elder is the son of Zebedee, brother of John, not to be confused with James the Younger who was the brother of Christ. I thought his personality was very interesting. For Christ to name them "sons of thunder," they must have deserved it!

According to Matthew 4:21-22, James and his brother were fishing with their father when Christ called them to be His disciples.

We also know that he was one of the three disciples who witnessed the transfiguration.

"And James the son of Zebedee, and John the brother of James; and he surnamed them Boanerges, which is, the sons of thunder." Mark 3:17 KJV

He seemed to be with Christ on many occasions, but he was not usually very outspoken, or at least there is not much record of his speaking.

On one occasion, he did show his temper! Christ had been talking with the disciples as they were traveling to Jerusalem. As the disciples were making plans along the way they came to a town with many Samaritans and they refused hospitality to Christ. When James and John heard about their unwillingness to have Christ in their town, they wanted Christ to rain fire down on the town and destroy it. But Christ told them "For the Son of man is not come to destrou men's lives, but to save them." Luke 9:56. Then they went on to another village. We don't hear much about him although he was one of the three that seemed to be with Christ the most.

Christ said "Ye know not what ye ask: can ye drink of the cup that I drink of? and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" The other disciples were displeased with James and John, but Christ calmed them down and answered their questions with another statement they probably couldn't understand any more than we could today. Christ told them "And whosoever of you will be the chiefest, shall be servant of all." Mark 10:35-45

I do not think that Christ's calling them "sons of thunder" was a negative nickname. Are we ever sons of thunder? James was so much a son of thunder that he became the first of the twelve to be a Christian martyr because he spoke up for Christ against pagans. Sometimes we are offended by the people who speak up because we want them to be more silent. We don't want to "stir up the waters." Didn't Christ turn the tables in the temple? Should we do something when we think things are wrong? Do we? Do you?

I'm not saying that we should go around with a temper all the time, but after prayer when we see something that we think needs to be said or done for the glory of God, should we be willing to do it? Are we willing to stick out our neck for Christ and His word? Are we willing to stand up to others who put down our Lord and Savior? The church needs to have people like him as well as people who are the silent workers.

Lewis Only when we all work together to spread the word of God to others in our community and serve missions will our church grow. But remember, the church building is just a building. We are the church.
