Simon the Zealot is fairly unknown in the Scriptures. Sometimes he is referred to as Simon the Canaanite. He was supposedly older when he decided to follow Jesus. He became just as staunch a supporter for Jesus as he had been for the Jewish patriots earlier. If he was a member of that group, his political views would have been completely opposite of Matthew who had been a staunch supporter

"And when they were come in, they went up into an upper room, where abode both Peter, and James, and John, and Andrew, Philip, and Thomas, Bartholomew, and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon Zealot, and Judas the brother of James." Acts.1:13 KJV
