Gentleness

"Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." Ephesians 4:2-3 NIV


Do you ever get tired of trying to be the nice guy? I do. Sometimes I want to say what I think even though it may offend someone. There are times when that is o.k., but it still needs to be said in a gentle way. Gentleness is translated various ways in the different versions of the Bible. Gentleness basically describes a temperament that is eventempered, tranquil, unpretentious, and

meek. It is not a weak quality. It is characteristic of one who has power and strength under control. The Bible says it is a strong quality.

In THE MESSAGE, Eugene Peterson translates Paul's message to the Ephesians as "In light of all this, here's what I want you to do. While I'm locked up here, a prisoner for the Master, I want you to get out there and walk—better yet, run!—on the road God called you to travel. I don't want any of you sitting around on your hands. I don't want anyone strolling off, down some path that goes nowhere. And mark that you do this with humility and discipline-not in fits and starts, but steadily, pouring yourselves out for each other in acts of love, alert at noticing differences and quick at mending fences." Ephesians 4:1-3

Being able to do this is quite a task for each of us, but it is doable with Christ as our leader. It doesn't mean just sitting around and not getting involved. It means getting involved in a positive way. There are often several ways to handle a particular person or situation. Handling that situation or talking with that person in a positive way often requires gentleness. It doesn't help if we offend the person. It doesn't help if we just make comments that "muddy the waters." Christ has given us many gifts. He has given us the gift of gentleness, but we have to accept it and then apply it to our daily lives. These characteristics are called "fruits of the Spirit" because they are the gifts given to us through Christ.

Often we think of gentleness and



meekness as a "Caspar Milquetoast" personality. Caspar was a comic strip character who was thought of as a timid soul who was shy, timid and unassertive. That is not the reference here if we read it with an open mind. Gentleness as told to us in the Bible is a challenge to approach life and its challenges with a positive attitude. We are to live positively with strength in acts of love.

We can have this gentleness and control over our emotions if we are right with the Lord. Horatio Spafford wrote a well-known hymn "It is Well with my Soul" that tells of this glorious peace.

"When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll; whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul. Though Satan should buffet, though trials should come, let this blest assurance control, that Christ has regarded my helpless estate, and hath shed his own blood for my soul. My sin, oh, the bliss of this glorious thought! My sin, not in part but the whole, is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more, praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul!

It sounds so easy, but it is not always that easy when we are faced with people who don't see things our way! Gentleness seems so easy for some. But that does not mean they are weak. They are strong. It means they have satisfaction and are strong in their faith. Is being satisfied a wrong thing? Sometimes we call it laziness, but satisfaction with God brings peacefulness to us as an individual. It also brings a commitment. Paul didn't tell them to just believe and sit on their hands. He challenged them to get to work while he was in prison. There is a powerful anthem, copyright 1995 which has been sung by our choir and was written by Joseph Martin that reminds us of Paul's challenge to the people found in Colossians and Ephesians called "Walk Worthy".


