"The Faithful"



"And in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary." Luke 1:26

Has an angel ever appeared to you? It could. Angels are mentioned 117 times in the Old Testament and 180 times in the New Testament. The angel Gabriel had an awesome assignment. His one assignment, involving the birth of Christ, is probably the one that most people accept or reject.

As a child I sang a song about Jacob's ladder. The Bible tells us that angels of God were ascending and descending on it. Other times we are told they just appeared. They came to the shepherds

The angel Gabriel was sent to earth during the lifetime of Daniel to interpret a vision. Daniel doubted at first. But, after he had time to think things through he realized the angel sent from God gave him the ability to interpret the vision.

Another time Gabriel was sent to Zachariah, a servant of the Lord who worked in the temple. Zachariah was paralyzed with fear. The angel told him to not be afraid. He and Elisabeth were going to have a son, and he would make not only Zachariah and his wife happy, but many other people also. Zachariah was told his son would be a forerunner of the Christ. We know the son as John the Baptist.

Then Zachariah asked the angel if he expected him to believe that. After all he and his wife, Elisabeth, were old. The angel then told him that his name was Gabriel and because he had doubted he would not be able to speak until his son was born. He told him that God's will would be accomplished through him in God's time!!! Was that an honor, or a punishment? Don't we often pray for things to be done according to our schedule?



Gabriel is sent to earth a third time. This time he goes to Mary and tells her that she will conceive and bear a son, and his name will be Jesus. She also doubts because she is a virgin and he tells her that the baby will be the Son of God. Can you blame her for not believing at first?


There are many things in life that we don't understand. I was told that as a child I was very inquisitive. I do remember my grandmother quoting to me that the Bible said "For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known." 1 Corinthians 13:12. Angelic figures appeared as early in the Bible as Genesis, and as late as Revelation. But, they don't appear as little cupids with wings as they are often depicted. That is our human interpretation. Angels are described in the Bible by Peter and Matthew, just to name a couple, as stronger than man, but not omnipotent. What does that mean? Their appearance is distinctive in many places where they are mentioned. Can you be an angel for someone?
