

A Wonderful Friend

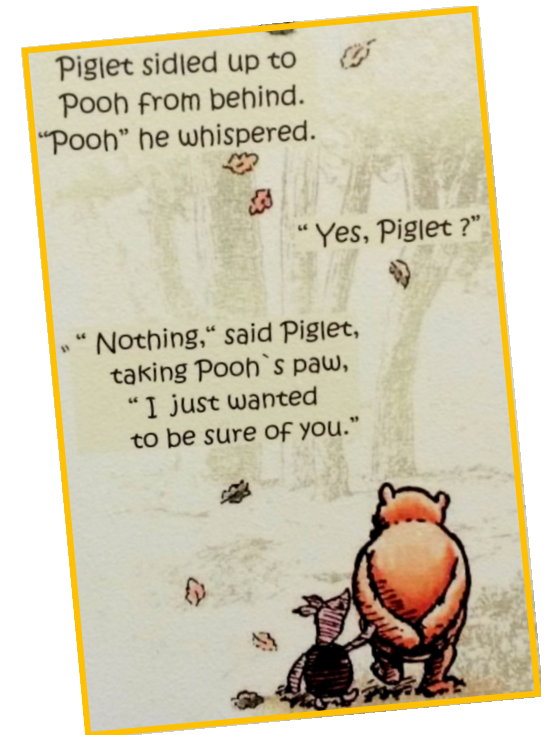
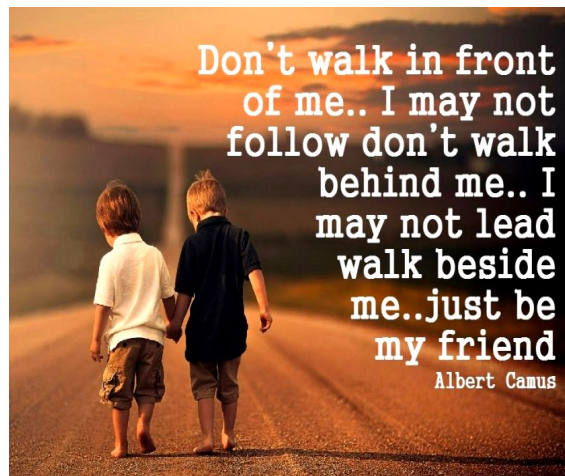

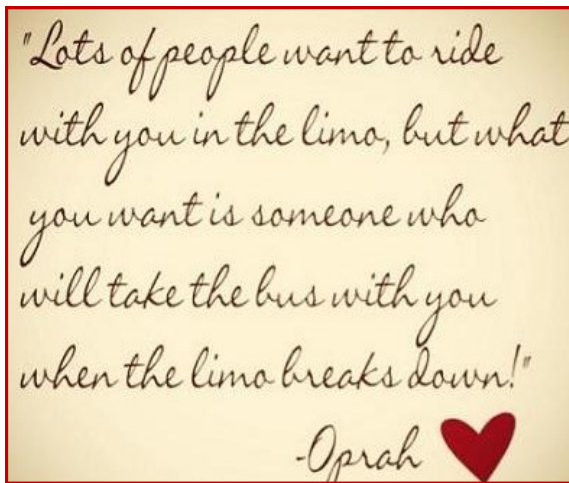
We can look to Barnabas as an example of a good friend., the kind of friend we want and the kind of friend we can be to others.
