We have much the same story about Lydia. These women served in what we would call minor roles, but their influence was great.

ple mourned because she was so well loved. They washed her body and laid it in an upper chamber as was the custom, but the people wanted her to live. They had heard about Peter being near and that he was doing miracles. They were sure he could help so they sent two men to ask Peter to come to Joppa and restore life to Dorcas. In Matthew 5:16 we are told: "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." We know that Dorcas was not a Christian because she did good works, but she did good works because she was a Christian.

Works can't do it!!! We can't take good works to Heaven with us, but we can lead others to know God's amazing love and then we will see them in Heaven, equal with us. We cannot earn a special place and we cannot earn salvation. But we can be a tremendous witness on this earth by the way we live and the deeds we do.

God gives each of us talents to use. Dorcas was just a seamstress, but evidently a very good one, and someone whom people loved. It sounds like she lived her life as a Christian should. But through her many came to believe. We are told to try to live our lives as God would want us to live. At work, or play, or any time, we are to seek to do God's will and lead others to Him. We pray "Thy will be done." But do we mean it?

The benefits we can receive by helping others are often not monetary, but they are numerous. The feeling that you helped someone cannot be measured in dollars. That feeling is a gift that no one can take away from you. Each of us can reach out and touch.

How about that young man that has grown up without a Dad? Can you take him for a hamburger or to a ball game? What about the single person that often seems so alone? Can you visit with him or her?

What about the person in your neighborhood that is too old and needs some bushes trimmed? Can we lend a hand without expecting anything in return? As Christians we are called to love one another and one way that we do that is by helping others. You will be rewarded in many ways you never thought about.
